But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Be ye not therefore anxious about the morrow; for the morrow shall take care for itself: sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

# Annual Walkathon for the Centretown Emergency Food Centre

The Centretown Churches Social Action Committee (CCSAC) will be hosting a virtual walk this year in lieu of their annual fundraising walk. The St. Barnabas team, headed by Yvonne Moses is asking for donations to support the CCSAC Food programme in Centretown. In the past Yvonne and others have asked to be sponsored for the annual walk, which is not possible this year. Please consider supporting the Food Centre by making a donation via the website <u>centretownchurches.org</u> or including a donation through our Parish givings. The demand for food assistance is rising and the extra support raised through the walkathon is needed more than ever.

## Financial Update – August 2020

We'd like to thank all our parishioners who have very faithfully continued to make their offerings despite the Church being closed. Here is our financial situation as of the end of June:

Income: Our offerings for the year so far are about \$25 000 below budget. Investment income has continued, but there has been no rental income during the closure, so that overall we are about \$30 000 behind our budget, equal to about 10% of our budget for the year.

Expenses: The good news is that our expenses are also lower - use of utilities, paper and other supplies has decreased because of the closure. We have also benefitted from a waiver of Parish Fair Share payments which the Diocese very generously offered for April and May; this has reduced expenses by about \$10 000.

Bottom Line: We are currently about \$20 000 in deficit. This is not an alarming amount, given the circumstances, but nonetheless we would ask you to continue to keep your Parish's needs in mind.
