

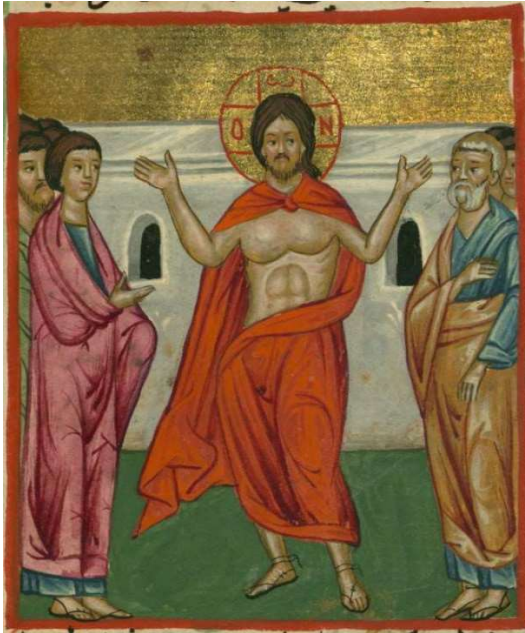

✠ The Holy Gospel is written in the twenty-fourth chapter of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, beginning at the thirty-sixth verse.

Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" But they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit.
